Axe The Tax !

Lambridge Liberal Democrats are calling on the Government to abolish the Council Tax and replace it with a fair local income tax.

Bath MP Don Foster's successor as Liberal Democrat shadow spokesman for local government, Ed Davey MP, said:

" The Council Tax is an unfair Tory Tax made worse by New Labour "

Don Foster added that the double-digit Council Tax increases of recent years have hit pensioners and those on low, fixed incomes hardest:

"The poorest fifth of society now pays around 7.8% of their income to local councils. The richest fifth pay less than 2% of their income in Council Tax"

The Lambridge Focus team ask:

"Why should pensioners and others on fixed, low incomes continue to subsidise top-earners?"

The Council Tax is unfair because you are charged according to the size of the property you occupy not on how able you are to pay the tax. A fair local income tax would be collected by the Inland Revenue, usually by PAYE, saving up to £500M per year; savings that will help pay for better schools and hospitals and more police.

An action group was formed to contest this wholly in-appropriate exploitation of a technicality in the planning regulations. The result of this community action is that the phone company appears to have just about abandoned any hope of erecting a mast in the area.

More Traffic Calming Wanted Say Ward Residents

In our last survey, two thirds of you who replied wanted to see traffic calming in their street. Nine out of ten wanted to see a 20mph limit near schools and 74% of you wanted to see a 20mph limit in their own street, showing how concerned you are at the speeds at which modern cars are driven in residential areas.

EU tackles air misery...

A new EU law passed by the European Parliament will see big payouts for all passengers, including charter-fliers, left stranded by airlines through cancellations or overbooking. Graham Watson, Liberal Democrat MEP covering Bath commented "These rules should make airlines think twice before overbooking or cancelling flights. Fewer passengers will be 'bumped' off flights. Those facing the inconvenience of long delays will receive the care and attention from the airlines they deserve, whatever their ticket cost".

Are you concerned about the bus services for Larkhall, Fairfield Park and London Road?

We are.

All Lambridge Focus Team members travel regularly to and from work on local buses No's 6, 7 and 13.



We are angered by how unreliable service has become in recent months. Timetables have been cut. Yet prices have risen, sometimes by four times inflation.

Why is it so bad? In the 1980s, the Tories created an unwelcome split between private bus companies, which operate the buses, and local authorities which provide bus stops, bus lanes and subsidise some services. Each points the finger of blame at the other. New Labour has done nothing since taking office in 1997 to reform local public transport.

We have put our concerns to Firstbus managers. We are seeking answers from Tory Councillor Sir Elgar Jenkins, BANES executive member for highways and transport.

We want to see timetable cuts restored and investment in modern buses —perhaps then we will be happier about paying higher fares.

We want to see investment in bus lanes and road-side information systems so that more people will want to make more city trips by bus and not by car, cutting road congestion.

We want to see the bus gate continue to operate in the rush hour, so bus passengers get to work or home without excess delay.
