NEW ROAD PLANS FOR LANSDOWN

When we talk to local residents on the doorstep, one issue comes up more than any other — the roads.

We're campaigning for repeating speed limit signs at the top of Lansdown Road to hammer the message home to drivers to **SLOWDOWN**.

With the expansion of residents parking, we are

backing calls for **MORE PUBLIC TRANSPORT**—especially affordable bus links for students to Bath Spa University College and the University Halls of Residence.

Local campaigner Rob Fenwick said "We're backing calls for **SPEED CAMERAS**, pointing both ways on the Lansdown Road. Speeding *up* the hill is just as common as speeding *down* it."



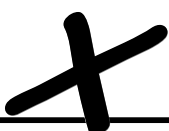
We're also supporting calls for more traffic calming, and safer streets for residential areas. Liberal Democrats are about **ACTION**.

Community wardens, a new initiative introduced by the Liberal Democrat council cabinet, are patrolling the streets around Lansdown ward.

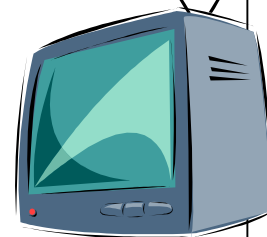
Their job is to look out for break-ins, graffiti, and anti-social behaviour, and to alert the authorities.
